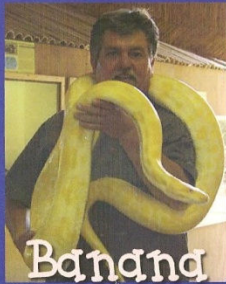


Earl

Wallaby-

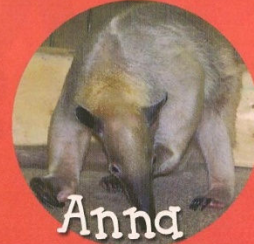
Female about 5 weeks old out of the pouch and was born at the Zoo. She may be found in parts of Australia and is the younger cousin to the Kangaroo.

Oscar has been with the Zoo for about six months. He enjoys eating insects and salads. He comes from central and eastern Australia.

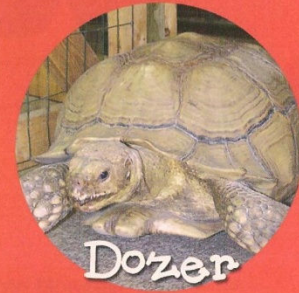


Green Iguana-
